#### Device time at school

The lockdown earlier in the year challenged us to think in new ways to connect with your families and to deliver learning. Teachers were challenged to extend their digital capabilities to ensure that learning could be accessible via devices and we know that families were also challenged to help their children access the learning online.

We have learnt an enormous amount from this experience and some of the key learnings have been implemented into our programmes at school. This has sparked interest from parents, and rightly so, into how much device time children have at school.

This week, we have conducted a survey of the amount of time students spend on devices at school. Teachers have been recording the amount of time and the type of activities that support learning in online environments. I look forward to sharing the findings with you via the school app, early next week.

#### **Sexuality Education**

Next Monday, 24 August at 5pm, we will hold a short meeting in the Library to inform parents about our sexuality programme. Students in years 5-8 will have a series of lessons starting from week 7 (31 August). Sexuality education covers self-worth, relationships, orientation, feelings & emotions, communication, intimacy, body image, sensuality, gender and ability to reproduce. It is a compulsory part of the New Zealand curriculum and is taught each year.
