Last week we made kale chips and they were a crunchy success.


This year we have grown a great crop of kale plants. Kale is super easy to grow and all we've had to do is keep it weeded and watered. Here is our kale all ready to harvest:

CAN YOU HELP with Predator Control? — Reliable people over 18 years of age are needed to assist with predator control in the East end of the Reserve, starting in February. The time commitment will not be onerous, especially if you already walk in the Reserve regularly. Training will be given.

During the first year, 181 possums, 106 mice, 94 rats, 5 weasels, 26 hedgehogs, and 4 stoats were caught. The increase in bird life is very noticeable as a result.

After lockdown over 5000 trees were planted, with the help of the Student Volunteer Army, Waimakariri Volunteer Army, Waimakariri Cubs/Keas, Conservation Volunteers and St Patricks School.

The Government's Covid's 'Jobs for Nature' scheme has enabled two staff to be employed to work in the Reserve for 16 weeks. It is hoped that this funding may continue.

A number of small treasures have been found that have survived the years of farming, spraying blackberry, gorse and broom and general neglect. We are now actively working to protect these little gems in the fen and dryland areas. Check out https://www.inaturalist.org/places/silverstream-reserve to see what is at the Reserve.

WEBPAGE Kate, one of our Rangers, was previously a webpage designer so has been working with the media team at Clarkville School and David to get this up and running. The history will be documented and future plans posted — an ongoing resource. As the saying goes 'good things take time'. It is now Silverstream Reserve's time and it is exciting.
