We all have a responsibility to keep our community safe when arriving at school and departing. Please do your part.



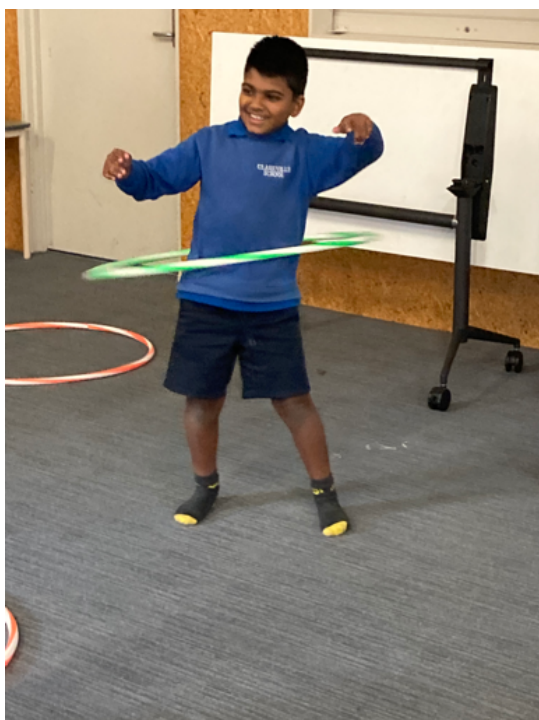
