In fact, Philosophy for Children strengthens every aspect of our learning model – critical thinking, creativity and collaboration.

Common themes explored through philosophy include truth, reality, freedom, justice, goodness, rights, mind, identity, love, friendship, rules and responsibility to name a few.

Teams have been establishing P4C routines and are beginning to engage in philosophical discussions. Your child's team may have been exploring questions such as, should animals be kept in zoos? It can be fun for families to have conversations like this at home.
